

Master Plan Update


- Current Master Plan approved April 2008

New Approach to Parks Master Planning

- Parks and Open Spaces Ordinance 2007-1141
- Approved by City Council on October 10, 2007
- Created 21 Park Sectors
- Assessment of park needs by sector/community




