I object the following amendments to our sign code for the following grounds:

My Family is now a 4th Generation ran business. Both Our founding Father and Mother set their roots within the Houston area after migrating here from outside the state. My father came here due to the fact of how desired the Houston market was within the Signage Industry. My mother came here with several degrees under her belt and started with another industry but then later, found the calling of the Sign business and the rest is history.

Fast forward 20 Years and we are now all watching the demise of the Sign Industry, the Iconic Art that Houston has always been known for, the pro-business and one's ability to effectively communicate with their clients. Our Company is now needing to question the sustainability of our Company within this market.

Scenic Houston has been pushing the same agenda for Years and there is no end in sight. While we are on the same page with the overall "Beatification" of the City as a whole, we are NOT wiling to continue to agree with the reduction of the height of our signs nor that of the square footage of signs.

The tallest that we can currently go in the City is 42'6 tall, many of the freeway systems that we now have are much taller and therefore, the signs can no longer be seen.
