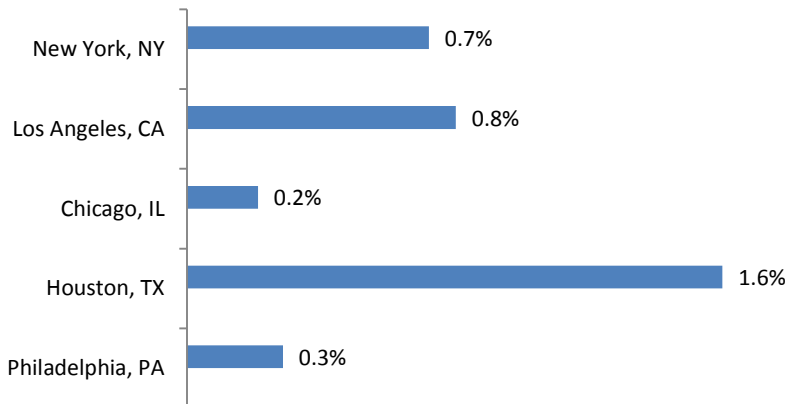

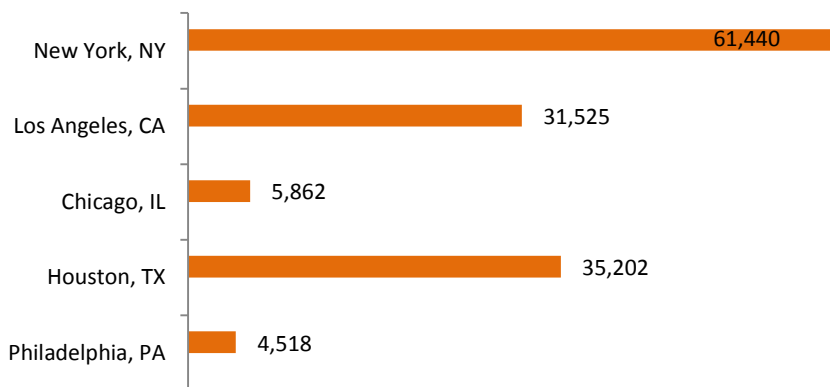

Population Numerical Change 2012-2013 Five Largest Cities in the U.S.



- Recently the U.S. Census Bureau released its annual population estimates for Cities and towns. The data is between July 1, 2012 and July 1, 2013.
- Among the top five largest populous cities, Houston ranked first (1.6% increase) in percent gain, followed by Los Angeles and New York (0.8% and 0.7% respectively).
- In terms of numeric growth, Houston ranked second with 35,202 additional residents following New York with 61,440 additional residents.
- According to the U.S. Census Bureau reports, South and West have fastest-growing municipalities during the same period. Pearland also listed as the fastest growing Houston suburban city.
