Solicitation Methods

The City of Houston announces formal and informal solicitations for goods and services on our website each fiscal year at https://www.houstontx.gov/bizwithhou/ProcurementPlan.html



Competitive bidding specifications are available through Bid Documents (awarded to low bidder), Requests for Proposal (RFPs), Requests for Qualifications (RFQs), Best Value Bid (BVB) and Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP). The type of method used depends upon the type of commodity or service being procured.

RFP/RFQ notices specify a scope of work and request that prospective vendors/providers supply a written statement of qualifications and related experience to perform the work. The City of Houston evaluates proposers based upon their capabilities and experience to perform the work specified and negotiates a contract with the best qualified vendor.
