A regular meeting of the Houston City Council was held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 9, 2024, Mayor John Whitmire presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Carolyn Evans-Shabazz, Fred Flickinger, Tiffany D. Thomas, Mary Nan Huffman, Mario Castillo, Joaquin Martinez, Martha Castex-Tatum, Julian Ramirez, Willie Davis, Twila Carter, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Randy Zamora, Legal Department and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, present. Council Member Edward Pollard absent on City business.

At 1:44 p.m., Mayor Whitmire called the meeting to order and recognized Council Member Castex-Tatum for a proclamation. Council Member Castex-Tatum presented a proclamation to HBREA (Houston Black Real Estate Association) President, Felicia Guidry, celebrating Realtist Week 2024. HBREA has been serving for 75 years through its efforts in exercising its mission of democracy and housing. Across the country, everyone is talking about housing and maintaining affordable housing stock in their City. Realtist Week in Houston is an annual event where cities across the United States are hosting free wealth building strategies, financial literacy sessions, workshops on housing and home ownership and voter registration. This year marks the 56th year of the Fair Housing Act.

Council Member Davis presented a proclamation to Lance Berkman recognizing him for his outstanding contributions to the community. William Lance Berkman was born in Waco, Texas, the son of Cynthia Ann and Larry Gene Berkman. He graduated from Canyon High School in New Braunfels in 1994, where he was a standout baseball player. Lance Berkman, one of the most versatile and productive hitters in the history of Major League Baseball, was inducted into the Houston Astros Hall of Fame in 2020, in recognition of his exceptional 12 seasons with the team. He was recently inducted into the Houston Sports Hall of Fame, Class of 2024. As first baseman, Lance Berkman notably played with the Houston Astros from 1999-2010. He spent a total of 15 seasons in Major League Baseball with the Houston Astros, the New York Yankees, the St. Louis Cardinals, and the Texas Rangers. Lance Berkman joined the Astros' vaunted "Killer B's" lineup that included Jeff Bagwell and Craig Biggio. He helped lead the Astros to three playoff appearances, including the club's first appearance in the World Series in 2005. On May 31, 2021, Lance Berkman was named the head baseball coach of the Houston Christian University. The City of Houston commends Lance Berkman's continuing baseball legacy as well as his selfless charity work.

Council Member Kamin presented a proclamation to I Love 11th celebrating the organization's contribution to the Heights community. Council Member Kamin attended the I Heart Festival back in September with over 30 businesses in the Heights area. Mr. Emmanuel Nuñez will introduce businesses that have been there and new businesses along the Heights corridors. 11th Street blossoms for dynamic hubs for shopping, dining, entertainment, murals by local artists, World War II Memorial, Height's corridor trail, schools, etc. The I Love 11th Street Festival has raised and reinvested over \$20,000.00 for nearby parks and the Heights Corridor.

Mayor Whitmire visited the Crestwood Civic Club last night and found out that garbage is being picked up on the same day.
