Proclamations

At 1:37 p.m. Mayor John Whitmire called the meeting to order and recognized Council Member Alcorn for a proclamation. Council Member Alcorn presented a proclamation to the MS150 Bike Riders. This year, we're celebrating the 40th year of the MS150. Members of the City of Houston Bicycle Team have raised more than \$20M dollars each year for Multiple Sclerosis research during their 11 years of participation. MS150 features over 13,000 cyclists and 3,500 volunteers. Since its inception, riders have raised nearly \$300M for the National MS Society.

Council Member Huffman presented a proclamation to Bob Gomal recognizing his work to help advance photojournalism. He was born August 14, 1933.
