A regular meeting of the Houston City Council was held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 23, 2024, Mayor John Whitmire presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Fred Flickinger, Tiffany D. Thomas, Mary Nan Huffman, Joaquin Martinez, Edward Pollard, Martha Castex-Tatum, Julian Ramirez, Willie Davis, Twila Carter, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Randy Zamora, Legal Department, and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, present. Council Members Carolyn Evans-Shabazz and Mario Castillo absent on personal business.

Proclamation

At 1:57 p.m., Mayor John Whitmire called the meeting to order and recognized Council Member Thomas for a proclamation. Mayor's Report
