

## **Butter Lemon Grilled Lobster**

Ingredients:

(4) Whole Lobsters

(2) Cloves of Garlic, Minced Completely)

(1/2) Parsley, Chopped

(1) Stick of Butter

(1) Whole Lemon
Dash of Lemon Pepper
Dash of Sea Salt
Dash of Cajun Seasoning

Recipe

Step 1: Start by prepping your lobsters. You will have to slice the lobsters down their backs and pull out the raw lobster meat. (Do Not Pull Out The Lobster Meat Completely)

Step 2: Melt your butter in a sauce pan and add your minced garlic, chopped parsley, and seasonings.

Step 3: Using a Basting Brush, baste the lobsters with the butter mixture.

Step 4: Bake the lobster tails in the over on 375 degrees for 20minutes.

Step 5: Pull tails out the oven, Cool and Rest. Slice Lemon and Squeeze Lemon Juice over the lobster tails and Enjoy!

>>Do Not eat any Spicy Foods (You Don't want to ruin your first kiss with bad breath.)




