Professional Services are:

- Defined in State law and include
 - Professional Engineers,
 - Land Surveyors, and
 - Real Estate Appraisers



Qualifications Based Selection:

- Request for Qualifications (RFQ) (published by City)
- Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) (submitted to City)
- Select most highly qualified provider(s)
- Demonstration of competence and qualifications
- CANNOT select on competitive bids



Statement of Qualifications:

- Technical Capabilities
- Related Experience and Past Performance
- Local Knowledge and Sustainable Approach
- Team Composition and Firm Capacity



Minority and Women Owned

- Mentor-Protégé Program
- Contracts in Five
- MWSBE goals by Contract 24%
- PWE attained 58% in FY15



Small and Disadvantaged

- Annual Revenues less then \$2 million
- Designated RFQs
- Increased to 6 (2 in FY16 selections)



FY16 Selection Distribution:

- Spread the Wealth concept
 - 1 Contract per firm
 - Historical selections
 - Technical Expertise or Specialty Knowledge



FY17 RFQ Types:

- Planning and Design
- Geotechnical, Environmental & Materials Testing
- Construction Management
- Program Management
- Technical Advisors for Operational Facilities



Limits on SOQ Submittals

- Rule of 8
 - Max. number of teams a firm can participate on per RFQ
- Rule of 12
 - Maximum number of prime submittals per firm
- Rule of 72
 Max. number of total submittals per firm (prime or sub)

Composition of Selection Panels:

- Technical Duties
 - Operations, Planning, Design & Construction
- Inclusiveness
 - Ethnicity & Gender



Tentative Selection Schedule:

- May 5 Contracts in Five event
- May 20 RFQs published on City website

- QUIET PERIOD BEGINS

- June 1 Pre-submission meeting at Hobby Center
- June 15 SOQ submittal deadline
