### **HPD** challenges during the Pandemic

- City of Houston has 671 square miles of patrol area
- There are large areas of open spaces to allow for large crowd gatherings
- Many of these spaces are not readily accessible to police vehicles
- Difficult to monitor without assigning patrol resources on foot
- Current video system (RTCC) is over a decade old
  - Does not have integration with other video feeds
  - Hardware is failing, obsolete
  - Currently all three large screens are down due to failed equipment
  - Does not allow for comprehensive insight into major city events



#### **Integrated Camera System**

- A modern video management system
  - Integrates with existing video systems such as PSVN as well as other government, corporate, and private security cameras and systems.
  - Can automate occupancy counting entering or exiting a facility
  - Can identify situations where social distancing guidelines are not being followed
  - Automates detection of people not wearing face masks
  - Provides 720 new cameras and installation included with system

#### **Benefits to HPD**

#### Technology can act as a force multiplier

- Placing cameras in critical areas across the city
- Can mitigate officer shortages due to the pandemic
- Supports HPD's effort to reduce violent crime
- Provides additional security for COVID testing and vaccination sites
- Augment police visibility across the city
- Support efforts to reduce crime due to the pandemic
- Allow more effective responses to public safety incidents
