# SINGLE AUDIT REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2024

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# Report on Internal Control Over Financial Reporting and on Compliance and Other Matters Based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*

#### **Independent Auditors' Report**

To the Honorable Mayor, Members of City Council, and City Controller of the City of Houston, Texas

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States (*Government Auditing Standards*), the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component units, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City of Houston, Texas (the "City"), as of and for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated November 18, 2024.

Our report includes a reference to other auditors who audited the financial statements of the Houston Firefighters' Relief and Retirement Fund, Houston Municipal Employees' Pension Trust Fund, and the Houston Police Officers' Pension Trust Fund, fiduciary component units of the City, which represent 100% of the assets, net position, and additions/deductions of the pension trust funds, within the fiduciary funds, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2024. We did not audit the financial statements of governmental and business-type discretely presented component units which represent 100% of the assets, net position (deficit)/fund balance, and revenues of the aggregate discretely presented component units. Those statements, except for the Houston Area Library Automated Network and Lamar Terrace Public Improvement District which were unaudited and represent less than 0.1% of the assets, net position and revenues of the governmental and business-type discretely presented component units, were audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us, and our opinion, insofar as it relates to the amounts included for such governmental and business-type discretely presented component units, are based solely on the reports of the other auditors. The financial statements of the Houston Police Officers' Pension Trust Fund were not audited in accordance with Government Auditing Standards. Additionally, except for the Houston Forensic Science Center, Houston Recovery Center LGC, and Memorial-Heights Redevelopment Authority, the governmental and business-type discretely presented component units were not audited in accordance with Government Auditing Standards. This report does not include the results of the other auditors' testing of internal control over financial reporting or compliance and other matters that are reported on separately by those auditors.

#### **Report on Internal Control Over Financial Reporting**

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the City's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control.





A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified.

#### **Report on Compliance and Other Matters**

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As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the City's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

#### **Purpose of This Report**

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the result of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the City's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.

#### Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal and State Program

#### Opinion on Each Major Federal and State Program

We have audited the City of Houston, Texas' (the "City") compliance with the types of compliance requirements identified as subject to audit in the *OMB Compliance Supplement* and Texas Grant Management Standards (TxGMS), as applicable, that could have a direct and material effect on each of the City's major federal and state programs for the year ended June 30, 2024. The City's major federal and state programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

In our opinion, the City complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal and state programs for the year ended June 30, 2024.

#### Basis for Opinion on Each Major Federal and State Program

We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS); the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States (*Government Auditing Standards*); the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance); and the audit requirements of TxGMS. Our responsibilities under those standards, the Uniform Guidance, and TxGMS are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of Compliance section of our report.

We are required to be independent of the City and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal and state program. Our audit does not provide a legal determination of the City's compliance with the compliance requirements referred to above.

#### Other Matter - Federal Expenditures Not Included in the Compliance Audit

The City's basic financial statements include the operations of the Houston Forensic Science Center, Houston Recovery Center LGC, and Memorial-Heights Redevelopment Authority, which expended \$5,779,338, \$2,126,200, and \$9,392,903 in federal awards, respectively, which are not included in the City's schedule of expenditures of federal awards during the year ended June 30, 2024. Our compliance





audit, described in the "Opinion on Each Major Federal and State Program," section does not include the operations of Houston Forensic Science Center, Houston Recovery Center LGC, and Memorial-Heights Redevelopment Authority because those entities engaged other auditors to perform an audit of compliance.

#### Responsibilities of Management for Compliance

Management is responsible for compliance with the requirements referred to above and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of effective internal control over compliance with the requirements of laws, statutes, regulations, rules, and provisions of contracts or grant agreements applicable to the City's federal and state programs.

#### Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of Compliance

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether material noncompliance with the compliance requirements referred to above occurred, whether due to fraud or error, and express an opinion on the City's compliance based on our audit. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with U.S. GAAS, *Government Auditing Standards*, the Uniform Guidance, and TxGMS will always detect material noncompliance when it exists. The risk of not detecting material noncompliance resulting from fraud is higher than that resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Non-compliance with the compliance requirements referred to above is considered material, if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, it would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user of the report on compliance about the City's compliance with the requirements of each major federal and state program as a whole.

In performing an audit in accordance with U.S. GAAS, *Government Auditing Standards*, the Uniform Guidance, and TxGMS, we:

- exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- identify and assess the risks of material noncompliance, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the City's compliance with the compliance requirements referred to above and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.
- obtain an understanding of the City's internal control over compliance relevant to the audit in order
  to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances and to test and report on internal
  control over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance and Texas Grant Management
  Standards, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's
  internal control over compliance. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and any significant deficiencies and material weaknesses in internal control over compliance that we identified during the audit.

#### **Report on Internal Control Over Compliance**

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a





federal or a state program on a timely basis. A *material weakness in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal or a state program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal or a state program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the "Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of Compliance" section above and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies in internal control over compliance. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above. However, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies in internal control over compliance may exist that were not identified.

Our audit was not designed for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of the Uniform Guidance and TxGMS. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

# Report on the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal and State Awards Required by the Uniform Guidance and Texas Grant Management Standards

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component units, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City as of and for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements. We issued our report thereon dated November 18, 2024, which contained unmodified opinions on those financial statements. Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the basic financial statements. The accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal and state awards are presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by the Uniform Guidance and TxGMS, respectively, and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with U.S. GAAS. In our opinion, the schedules of expenditures of federal and state awards are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

The information in these schedules is presented in accordance with the requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance), and Texas Grant Management Standards (TxGMS), respectively. Therefore, some amounts presented in these schedules may differ from amounts presented in, or used in, the preparation of the basic financial statements.
- 2. Expenditures reported on the schedules are presented on the modified accrual basis of accounting for the governmental funds and the accrual basis of accounting for the enterprise funds, which is described in Note 1 to the City's financial statements. Such expenditures are recognized following the cost principles contained in the Uniform Guidance or TxGMS, as applicable, wherein certain types of expenditures are not allowable or are limited as to reimbursement.
- 3. Federal and state awards provided to subrecipients are treated as expenditures when the City is notified by the subrecipient of the expenditure. Amounts reported in the schedules may not agree with the amounts reported in the related financial reports filed with grantor agencies because of accruals, which would be included in the next report filed with the agencies. Negative amounts shown on the schedules represent adjustments or credits made in the normal course of business to amounts reported as expenditures in prior years.
- 4. The City did not elect to use the 10% de minimis indirect cost rate since it either charges indirect cost specifically approved in a grant award document or, when allowed, allocates indirect cost rate previously approved from its cognizant agency. These rates determine the recovery of indirect costs incurred from the delivery of federal and state grant funded programs and Enterprise and Internal Service Fund charge backs.
- 5. **Loans Outstanding** The City had the following direct federal loan balances outstanding at June 30, 2024, that were reported as federal award expenditures in the schedule of expenditures of federal awards.

6. **Noncash Awards** – The City received donated vaccines directly from the federal government under Assistance Listing No. 93.268 which were reported at assessed value provided by the federal agency. The amount of such donated vaccines issued/consumed for the year ended June 30, 2024, was \$4,883,460 and was reported as federal award expenditures in the schedule of expenditures of federal awards. The value of donated vaccines as of year ended June 30, 2024, was \$861,650.

Additional estimated expenditures in the amount of \$44.4M for FEMA were incurred in the current and prior years but were not obligated as of June 30, 2024.
- 8. **Contingencies** The City receives various grants to cover the costs of specified programs. Final determination of eligibility of costs will be made by the grantors. Should any costs be found ineligible, the City will be responsible for reimbursing the grantors for these amounts.
