Appendix D Texas CDBG Disaster Recovery Program, Round 2.2 Outreach Management Contractor Scope of Work

The City of Houston is required to perform targeted outreach to potential program applicants. The targeted outreach must be according to a GLO-approved Outreach Plan that is developed based on the results of the Needs Assessment. The Outreach Management Contractor (Contractor) will provide technical assistance by:

- Assisting with document writing and editing
- Providing data salient to the completion of the Outreach Plan document
- Providing data acquisition and interpretation services
- Providing GIS Mapping services
- Assisting with the identification of any third party organizations that may facilitate the execution of an Outreach Plan

Contractor will manage the execution of the Outreach Plan. Contractor will assist with training and managing third party organizations that may facilitate the execution of an Outreach Plan. Contractor will:

- Identify outreach locations within the targeted areas within the City of Houston as defined by the Needs Assessment
- Identify and hire additional staff (focused on Section 3) for outreach to the targeted areas
- Provide logistical assistance and training of outreach personnel and coordinating staff
- Monitor and direct the outreach activities utilizing the forms and directives provided by the program including Initial Application Forms, Call Logs, Activity Logs, Identification of vacant locations and contact information Form, and other forms as may be required
- Provide summary reports and other documents as directed via electronic format and at a minimum provide weekly delivery to the Houston Office a hardcopy of applications collected
- Comply with project timeline and tasks as provided by the program
- Provide close out assistance on the outreach component of the project as required by the program

Program outreach will last no longer than 90 days. The expected number of Outreach forms that will need to be collected by targeted outreach is 3200 to be amended as dictated by eligibility trends and program funding availability.

On a daily basis, the Contractor shall collect any outstanding completed outreach forms and transfer form data to Houston staff.
