Need Assessment Development using the City's Hazard Mitigation Plan

The City Submitted the Action Plan to HUD

HUD Approved the City's Action Plan





Grant Requirements:

- Funds must be spent within 12 years
- Half of funds must be expended during the first half (six years) of the grant
- At least 50% of funding must benefit low- and moderate- income (LMI) communities






CDBG-MIT PROGRAM

CAMBRIDGE VILLAGE PARK

Drainage improvements in the Ramblewood neighborhood to create 24 acre-feet of retention storage.





FRENCHTOWN

Improvements for conveying storm water runoff, consisting of ditch regrading and re-establishment to the receiving drainage systems, replacement and resized driveway culverts, sidewalks and asphalt pavement.





MELROSE PARK

Improvements for conveying storm water runoff including ditch regrading and re-establishment to receiving points of the Harris County Flood Control District drainage systems, replacement and resized driveway culverts, and asphalt pavement overlay or replacement.





Turkey Gully

Drainage improvement in Shady Acres Neighborhood to create drainage diversion from Turkey Gully to White Oak Bayou.


DETAILS The City of Houston will receive more than \$61 million in Community Development Block Grant Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) to fund mitigation projects that will lower the risk of impacts from future disasters. The Housing & Community Development Department is creating an action plan for how this money will be spent. This action plan is our grant application to the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD). Money for mitigation projects cannot be used for emergency response services. Projects will focus on local and regional mitigation priorities that will have long-lasting effects.


