THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR DR15 SWAT 12A BONITA GARDENS DRAINAGE AND PAVING IMPROVEMENTS ("FIRST AMENDMENT") is made on the counter-signature date by and between the CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS (the "City"), a home-rule city of the state of Texas, and R.G. MILLER ENGINEERS, INC. (the "Consultant"), a Texas corporation.

RECITALS:

- Pursuant to Ordinance No. 2017-0844 (October 25, 2017), the City and the Consultant entered into a Professional Engineering Services Agreement for DR15 SWAT 12A Bonita Gardens Drainage and Paving Improvements (the "Original Agreement").
- 2. The City and the Consultant now desire to amend the terms of the Original Agreement, and appropriate additional money for the Project.
- 3. **NOW THEREFORE**, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I.

Section 3.4, "Limit of Appropriation", of Article 3, "Duties of City", of the Original Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

3.4 Limit of Appropriation. Engineer recognizes that under certain provisions of the Charter of the City of Houston, the City may not obligate itself by contract to an extent in excess of an amount appropriated by the City Council and further recognizes that only \$961,064.00 has been appropriated and budgeted by City Council to pay the Cost of Basic Services hereunder and that only

- **\$358,936.00** has been appropriated and budgeted by the City Council to pay the cost of Additional Services hereunder for a total amount of **\$1,320,000.00**.
- 3.4.1 In the event the appropriation for Basic Services is insufficient to compensate Engineer for Basic Services, Engineer shall suspend its Basic Services at such time as the total appropriation for Basic Services is expended, but shall resume such Basic Services, if and when authorized by the Director as provided elsewhere herein, upon transfer of funds by the Director or appropriation of additional funds by the City Council for Basic Services.
- 3.4.2 In the event the appropriation for Additional Services is insufficient to compensate Engineer for authorized Additional Services in accordance with the payment provisions of Article 3 hereof, Engineer shall suspend its Additional Services at such time as the total appropriation for Additional Services is expended, but shall resume such Additional Services, if and when authorized by the Director as provided elsewhere herein, upon transfer of funds by the Director or appropriation of additional funds by the City Council for Additional Services.
- 3.4.3 The Director may authorize the transfer of funds between Basic Services and Additional Services when necessary to continue services by issuing a Supplemental Notice to Proceed, provided that the transfer of funds does not exceed 25% of the Negotiated Lump Sum in the original Notice to Proceed and total funds authorized do not exceed the total amount appropriated by City Council.

ARTICLE II.

Except as modified under this First Amendment, the Original Agreement will remain in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the Original Agreement, and this First Amendment, this First Amendment shall prevail.

Background:

<u>SUBJECT:</u> First Amendment to Professional Engineering Services Contract between the City and R.G. Miller Engineers, Inc., for DR15 SWAT 12A Bonita Gardens Drainage and Paving Improvements.

RECOMMENDATION: (SUMMARY) Approve First Amendment to the Professional Engineering Services Contract with R.G. Miller Engineers, Inc., transfer and allocate funds.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project is part of the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant – 2015 Disaster Recovery program and is necessary to reconstruct inadequate drainage systems and reduce the potential for structural flooding. This project represents how the City will use its grant allocation to support recovery in the most impacted and distressed areas included in the 2015 major disaster declaration. This project demonstrates the City's commitment to recover, rebuild, and focus on resilience for its citizens.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project consists of design and construction of storm water drainage and paving improvements and necessary utilities to serve the Bonita Gardens area.

LOCATION: The project area is generally bound by Laura Koppe Road on the north, Union Pacific Rail Road on the south, Lockwood Drive on the east, and US 59/IH 69 on the west. The project is located in Key Map Grids 454B, C, F, G, K, L, P, & Q.

PREVIOUS HISTORY AND SCOPE: Under the original Contract, all funds were allocated to Basic Services. All Phase I services have been completed. Additional Services are now required to complete the project. City Council approved the original Contract on October 25, 2017 under Ordinance No. 2017-0844. The scope of services under the Original Contract consisted of Phase I – Preliminary Design, Phase II – Final Design, Phase III – Construction Phase Services and Additional Services. Under this Contract, the Consultant completed Phase I Preliminary Design.

SCOPE OF THIS AMENDMENT AND FEE: This amendment modifies the original scope of services to transfer funds from Basic Services to Additional Services. The transfer of funds from Basic to Additional Services require more than 25% of the Negotiated Lump Sum in the original Notice to Proceed, which was appropriated by City Council. The re-allocation to PES Contract Award is requested for additional services; Surveying, Traffic Control Plan, Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan, Drainage Studies, Subsurface Investigation, Tree Protection & Mitigation Plan, Public Meetings, and Reproduction services. An additional allocated amount of \$132,000.00 and a transfer of \$238,936.00 from Basic Services to Additional Services is now required to complete Additional Services. The Additional Service is anticipated to include design service during Phase III.

The total requested allocation is \$132,000.00 to be allocated as follows: \$120,000.00 for contract services and \$12,000.00 for CIP Cost Recovery.

PAY OR PLAY PROGRAM: The proposed contract requires compliance with the City's 'Pay or Play' ordinance regarding health benefits for employees of City contractors. In this case, the Contractor provides health benefits to eligible employees in compliance with City policy.

M/WBE PARTICIPATION: The M/WBE goal established for this project is 24.00%. The original Contract amount totals \$1,200,000.00. The Consultant has been paid \$736,643.84 (61.39) % to date. Of this amount, \$200,547.43 (27.22) % has been paid to M/WBE sub-consultants to date. Assuming approval of the requested Amendment, the contract amount will increase to \$1,320,000.00. The consultant proposes the following plan to meet the M/WBE goal.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF HOUSTON AND R.G. MILLER ENGINEERS, INC. FOR DR15 SWAT 12A BONITA GARDENS DRAINAGE AND PAVING IMPROVEMENTS; CONTAINING PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. The City Council hereby allocates the sum or sums of money set out in the title of this Ordinance, out of the respective fund or funds set out in such title as follows: the sum of \$1,200,000.00 is allocated for contract services related to the project described in the title and the sum of \$192,000.00 is allocated for CIP Cost Recovery relating to construction of facilities financed by the fund described in such title.

Section 2. The City Council hereby approves and authorizes the contract, agreement or other undertaking described in the title of this ordinance, in substantially the form as shown in the document which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute such document and all related documents on behalf of the City of Houston. The City Secretary is hereby authorized to attest to all such signatures and to affix the seal of the City to all such documents.

- Section 3. The Mayor is hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to effectuate the City's intent and objectives in approving such agreement, agreements or other undertaking referenced in the title of this ordinance, in the event of changed circumstances.
- Section 4. The City Attorney is hereby authorized to take all action necessary to enforce all legal obligations under said contract without further authorization from Council.
- Section 5. There exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; however, in the event that the Mayor fails to sign this Ordinance within five days after its passage and adoption, it shall take effect in accordance with Article VI, Section 6, Houston City Charter
