Biography

Motivated by a belief in the transformative power of creativity, Veronica Cabrera-Moreno, known as Roni, has been a passionate advocate for the arts. Since 2012, she has used art as a powerful tool for healing, pride, and community empowerment. Roni's journey began with a commitment to enrich her community through diverse art initiatives, including organizing neighborhood pride events such as the Sabor del Northside Festival and creating large-scale murals for mission-driven organizations.

Roni's notable mural projects include her work on the World Cup art bid and her contributions to mission-based organizations such as The Houston Furniture Bank and HIM Food Pantry. She has extended her impact by teaching cultural arts to children, organizing art shows, and partnering with organizations to provide STEAM education in underserved neighborhoods. Her dedication to inclusivity is evident in her work with refugee children, ensuring that art remains accessible and serves as a vital tool for healing and expression.

In addition to her artistic endeavors, Roni has made significant contributions to supporting survivors of human trafficking through her coordination of art programming with Brazen Table. Her global experiences—such as delivering art supplies to Sri Lanka and exploring artist villages in Taiwan—have deepened her understanding of the importance of providing art resources in underserved communities, including her own.

In 2021 Roni received national recognition from singer Kelly Clarkson for her innovative Art Bus, a mobile initiative that broke down barriers by bringing art directly to communities in need. Building on this success, she founded Art in the Heart, a community art center offering a holistic approach to art and resources for her neighborhood and underserved children.

Through Art in the Heart, Roni promotes civic engagement, provides resources during crises, and offers studio spaces for artists who lack access to other facilities. She has also created a community garden and green space, offering a safe place for her neighborhood to rest and reflect. In just three years, Art in the Heart has provided arts programming and access to over 6,000 individuals, reflecting its profound impact on the community.

Roni's unwavering dedication ensures that art continues to be a vital and healing force in the lives of those she serves.
