WHAT IS AN ANNUAL ACTION PLAN?




- Annual strategic plan with goals and objectives




WHAT WE'VE DONE



Single-Family Home Repair



Goal: Preserve Supply of Affordable Housing

Goal Outcome: Homeowner Housing Repaired/Reconstructed

May be eligible for home repair if

- You own your home
- The home is your primary residence
- Current property taxes paid to the City of Houston
- Your income is at or below 80% of Area Median Income
- Your home is outside the floodway www.houstontx.gov/housing/home-repair
