Presented by Gatorade and Nike, the Jr. NBA/Jr. WNBA serves existing recreational youth basketball leagues through support programs for players, coaches, parents, and officials. An emphasis on a mix of on- and off-court instruction fosters skill development, team play, and sportsmanship, resulting in a fun and rewarding basketball experience where players learn what it takes to be successful in the game and in everyday life. Striving to achieve goals while learning to respect teammates, officials, coaches, and opponents is important to character development in youth.
