CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chair's report was given by Chair, Maverick Welsh. Mr. Welsh reviewed the Speaker Rules for the audience and also announced he wrote a letter to Planning and Development Director, Patrick Walsh expressing the HAHC and the public's frustration with the lack of enforcement of the Historic Preservation ordinance. He will also be appointing a sub-committee from the Historic Commission to work with the Planning Commission and Planning Department to review the Historic Preservation ordinance and possibly recommend some changes to City Council in the future. He also mentioned the vocal opposition of the Wheatley/E.O. Smith school demolition and asked Omar Izfar with the Legal Department to give a report next month on what the Commission can and can't do to prevent the demolition. He also encouraged each Commissioner to participate in each vote and to make motions to help move the meeting along.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Director's report was given by Director, Patrick Walsh. Mr. Walsh updated the Commission on the decision of the Historic Commission that went before the Planning Commission on appeal and then on to City Council. The application for 1815 Cortlandt Street to relocate the home outside one of the Heights Historic Districts, City Council granted the appeal and overturned the denial of the certificate of appropriateness to relocate the home. The motion to overturn was made by the District Council Member where the property was located.

MAYOR'S CULTURAL LIAISON REPORT

The Mayor's Cultural Liaison report was given by Ms. Minnette Boesel, the Mayor's Assistant for Cultural Affairs. Ms. Boesel mentioned an exhibit at the Houston Public Library's Julia Ideson Building "The Founding of the Houston Public Library: Women's Clubs & Civic Activism at the turn of the Twentieth Century." Also, the Houston Arts Alliance is celebrating the East End and the opening of

the new Light Rail and will also be coordinating an exhibit at the Julia Ideson, "Stories of a Workforce: Celebrating the Centennial of the Houston Ship Channel" opening September 2.

Motion was made by Commissioner Bucek, seconded by Commissioner Stava to grant the Certificate of Appropriateness for item B-41 with the conditions that the applicant modify the addition front gable roof to a hip roof and retain the following existing conditions - 2' foundation height, round front porch columns, and front gable eave returns. Motion carried with Commissioner Cosgrove, Commissioner Elliott and Commissioner Blacklock-Sloan opposing.

Was taken and acted on earlier in the meeting.

Motion made by Commissioner Cosgrove, seconded by Commissioner Blacklock-Sloan that the Houston Archaeological and Historical Commission recommend to City Council the Landmark Designation of the Howard Oil Company Seedhouse at 1200 National Street; the Magnolia Cemetery at 816 Montrose Boulevard; the Emile Cuenod House at 2505 Pelham Drive; and the Margaret Wiess and James A. Elkins Jr. House at 3405 Meadow Lake Lane. Motion carried unanimously.

D. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC AND THE HAHC:

Ida A. Powell requested the HAHC initiate a Landmark designation for the historic stately structure located at 1700 Gregg Street which dates back to the 1920's and housed the schools known as Phillis Wheatley, E.O. Smith and H. P. Carter. Notable graduates include Congress members Barbara Jordan and Mickey Leland, US Olympian George Foreman and a host of other professionals.

Reverend John Fields stated the E.O. Smith institution has great significance to the First Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church congregation and also asked the HAHC to adopt and grant the Historical designation. When the church was under construction, the congregation met at the E.O. Smith institution.


Minnette Boesel stated that 2236 Stanmore Drive is a significant house and was surprised it was recommended for denial as a Landmark Designation and will encourage the applicant to resubmit the application for the HAHC's reconsideration.

Commissioner Elliott stated for Landmark designation the applicant should understand if they want to make a case under any of those criteria they should be able to. Also, asked if the Wheatley High School would be on the agenda next month.


Bob Birner stated they were never given the opportunity to speak with the inspector and the applicant didn't get a chance to rebut when there are unlimited amount of rebuttals given to staff and the Commission doesn't extend the same courtesy to the applicant. Also, his information was deliberately withheld and was asked to provide an additional document on the day of the deadline.

E. ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business brought before the commission, a motion was made by Commissioner Cosgrove, seconded by Commissioner Hellyer to adjourn the meeting 6:50 p.m.
